¹⁸. . . knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, ¹⁹but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. **1 PETER 1:18,19**

God is willing and able to save us from illness, financial crisis, or family problems. But the biggest problem we need rescuing from is sin, which leads to spiritual death or separation from God. From the beginning, God had carefully planned a way to rescue us and give us eternal life (Titus 1:2). Jesus is the Perfect Redeemer whose sacrifice completely satisfied God’s justice and appeased His wrath against our sin (Hebrews 7:27). In this lesson, we will look at what Jesus, the Lamb of God, did for us.

1 We are ransomed from an empty life.

While the writer of Ecclesiastes pronounced that everything we do in this world is vanity, fleeting, meaningless, or futile, Jesus rescued us from the futility of our worldly ways by freely offering us a full life (John 10:10). He solved the root of our problems, which is sin. What does it mean to be ransomed? Why could we never save ourselves?
